DAMAGE LEVELS


DESTROYED

The home is a total loss or damaged to such an extent that repairs are not economically feasible.


Any one of the following may constitute a status of **Destroyed**:

1. Structure is not economically feasible to repair
2. Structure is premanently uninhabitable
3. Complete failures to major components of structure (ex. basement walls/foundation, walls, roof etc)
4. Only foundation remains
5. Two or more walls destroyed and roof susbstantially damaged.
6. House pushed off foundation
7. An unaffected structure that will require removal or demolition (homes in imminent danger due to impending landslides, mudslides or sinkholes, etc)

FLOOD DAMAGE: SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING




Major


The home has sustained structural or significant damages, is uninhabitable and requires extensive repairs. Any one of the following may constitute **Major** damage:

1. Substantial failures of structural elements of the residence (ex. wall, floors, foundations, etc.)
2. Has more than 50% damage to structure
3. One foot or more of water on the first floor (of a home with basement and furnace and water heater were located in the basement)
4. Without a basement, major damage would be in the 2 to 4 foot range, depending on length of time home was inundated.

FLOOD DAMAGE: SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING




Minor


The home is damaged and uninhabitable, but may be made habitable in a short period of time. Some of the items that determine **Minor** damage are:

1. Windows or doors blown in
2. One foot or more of water/sewer back up in basement (ex. If furnace or water heater damage).
3. Has less than 50% damage to structure

WIND DAMAGE: SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING




FLOOD DAMAGE: SINGLE FAMILY DWELLING




Affected
