## FIRST SELECTMAN'S REPORT

It was dry summer but the 18 inches of rain in the fall caused serious runoff and **flooding problems** on October 22 in the southern part of town. Cross Lane became impassable under the railroad bridge and Route 156 had 5 feet of water over it near Windward Lane. Our emergency response effort was outstanding under the direction of Dave Roberge and we thank volunteers from fire, ambulance and Red Cross along with members of our public works and police departments for their many hours spent to keep our residents safe.

At the **Rogers Lake Authority** meeting on November 1 the Authority recommended **mechanical harvesting** to combat the weed problem in the lake. It was also recommended that residents with property on the lake use **hydro raking to deal with weeds** directly in front of their properties. It was estimated the cost of a mechanical harvesting would be around \$35,000 and it was noted that this method would not eradicate the weeds but merely trim them. The Authority will work with the Boards of Selectmen of Lyme and Old Lyme to develop a budget and timetable. Concerning the repair of the **Rogers Lake dam**, the Board of Selectmen reviewed a second engineering proposal and determined that its price for the work was greater than the

original engineering estimate, so the decision was made to award the work to Jacobsen Engineering of Chester. The plan is to have engineering work performed over the winter, put the contract for repair out in the spring and perform the work next summer. However, we are mindful that we will be working with the DEP, so we hope our timing estimate is not too aggressive.

On November 5, the Towns of Lyme and Old Lyme had a ribbon cutting ceremony for the **Playground at the Town Woods Park**. Rep. Marilyn Giuliano, First Selectman Koch from Lyme, myself, Bob Dunn, Chair of the Town Woods Building Committee, and Teri Lewis and Katie Balocca, co-chairs of the Playground Committee, participated in the ceremony. The 13 volunteer members of the Playground Committee were recognized and thanked for raising \$45,000 for the playground and Rep. Giuliano was thanked for her efforts in securing a \$20,000 grant from the State of CT. The Towns of Lyme and Old Lyme are still awaiting confirmation that they will receive \$150,000 each to help construct 2 Phase II softball/baseball fields to the rear of the Field House.

In September, Kay Mannetho, our **Social Services Coordinator and Senior Center Director**, an-

nounced she will be relocating to New Hampshire. She served our towns faithfully since 2001 and she was well loved by our seniors. A search committee formed to find a replacement was pleased to receive 9 applications for the position. After due consideration, the search committee has recommended that Sherri Meyer of Westbrook be hired and we look forward to the enthusiasm she will bring to the positions.

The **Church Corner Committee** reviewed an additional proposal for engineering services associated with road reconstruction and related work at the south end of Lyme St. The proposed cost was considerably more than the first estimate, so the Board of Selectman voted to proceed with Rowley, Hendriks and Assoc. of Old Lyme. The Committee also met with representatives from VHB, Inc. of Middletown which will submit a proposal to perform a traffic safety review of the Church Corner plan. Once the safety review is complete, the final engineering plans can be finalized and sent to the DEP. If all goes well, we hope to perform the work in the summer of 2007.

The Board of Selectmen and Superintendent Klein have discussed the concept of moving the **bus barn** location from Jadon Dr. to a section

of landfill property the Town owns off Four Mile River Rd. when the current bus contract expires in 2010. We are working on a number of issues in an effort to determine whether or not the Town should proceed with the development of the property for the bus barn. From the Town's standpoint, we are willing to front the cost of developing this site if we have a commitment from the school that the school will use the facility in five years. District 18 submitted a grant application to the EPA in hopes of obtaining funding to install **exhaust filters** and pay the premium for ultra low diesel fuel. We are still waiting for a response from the EPA.

The **Information Technology Committee** recommended to the Board of Selectmen that the Town sign a contract with "e-Tran" so that we may offer **electronic payment options** to our citizens. Once the details are sorted out, one will be able to pay taxes via the Internet rather than by mail or in person. A 50-cent transaction fee for each payment should be minor in comparison to the benefit. The Committee and the Dist. 18 Business Manager also heard a presentation from a financial accounting service provider but there will be numerous future meetings on this topic before any decision is made.

The **Open Space Committee** is still working on a proposal to acquire 52 acres of land near the Black Hall Club off Rte 156 and Buttonball Rd. This would add to an important greenway that runs from the north end of town toward Long Island Sound. The Sound View Parking Committee has been reconstituted and renamed the **Beach Improvement Committee**. This more general name means the Committee will look at a broader scope of issues that are of importance to the shoreline residents from White Sand Beach to Old Lyme Shores. The Committee will likely recommend changes to some of the Town's ordinances, such as increasing the fines for those who operate illegal parking lots.

Another committee has been meeting to consider what the Town could do for the victims of **hurricane Katrina**. The Committee believes the Town should "adopt" a town in the affected area which would provide an opportunity for us to not only provide financial support but also to actively participate, including actually going to the "adopted" community to help. There will be more on this later. The **Town and Police unions** have concluded negotiations and have signed a new four-year contract. We have been pleased with our Resident State Trooper service, which includes two troopers and six local police officers.

During my recent trip to Scotland, I was privileged to have a meeting with the Provost (Mayor) of Inverness. We discussed the issues he is dealing with, some of which sound very familiar. I presented him with a Proclamation from our Board of Selectmen and he presented me with a framed watercolor highlighting scenes from Inverness. The Essex Savings Bank presented Old Lyme and seven other towns in the bank's market area each with a **\$1,000 check** to be used for beautification purposes. I will speak with the *Tree Commission* and the *Duck River Garden Club* for suggestions for its use. Last, I invited four High School students to attend the **CT Conference of Municipalities conference** in Hartford. We heard interesting speakers and attended various workshops that focused on governmental service and issues facing CT municipalities.


