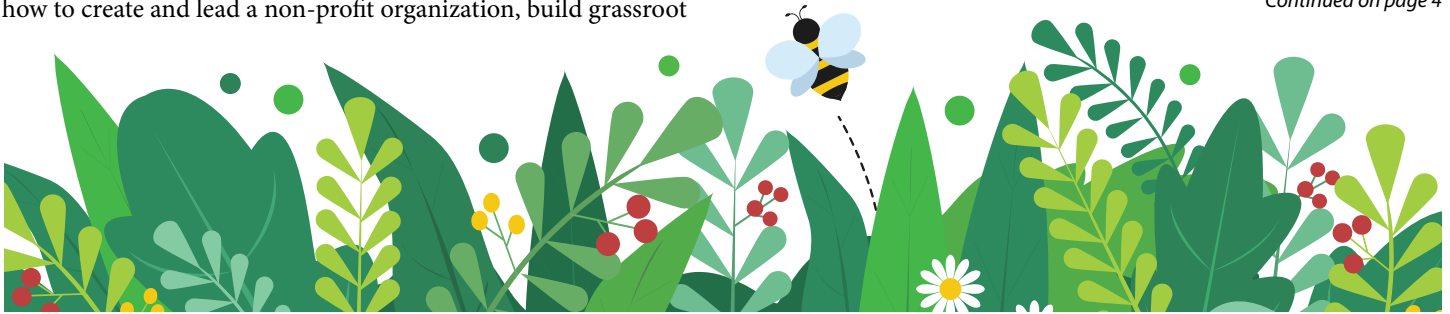

financial support, and rally people to grow, harvest, and send over 5,000 pounds of fresh vegetables to food banks across the region. He is a champion for creating community around local environmental and food security solutions. The catalyst for his community building efforts began when Jim participated in the 2020 UConn Master Gardening Program. Jim's required outreach hours for the program were met by volunteering at the Food for All garden in Clinton. His admiration for how the Food For All garden and other similar gardens in the region met the increasing needs of community food banks was equaled by his appreciation for the sense of community they created. This was something Jim thought the Lyme-Old Lyme community could replicate.

Jim and his volunteers have utilized a parcel of land at Town Woods Park for this community garden. The location is perfect because of its proximity to the onsite playground, sports fields, and the Lymes' Senior Center, making the garden accessible to all ages in both towns. From his first Zoom meeting in March 2021, Jim's goal was to provide fresh produce to help alleviate food insecurities and support healthy nutrition to families in Old Lyme, Lyme, and surrounding communities. That Zoom meeting resulted in a handful of volunteers ready to take on Jim's challenge. In 2021, the group raised money and built garden fencing while preparing the soil. In 2022, their first growing season, the Food Share Garden logged more than 700 hours of volunteers' time in producing and donating over 2500 pounds of fresh produce to the Shoreline Soup Kitchens & Pantries and the United Way of Southeastern Connecticut. During this past year's second growing season, Jim's leadership contributed to 31 volunteers logging over 1000 hours, again producing more than 2500 pounds of produce, and converting over a thousand pounds of food waste to compost for next year's garden. Still in just its second growing season, the Lyme-Old Lyme Food Share Garden was one of three giving gardens to receive the Innovation Award from the United Way of Southeastern Connecticut.

Jim also serves our town as co-chair of the Solid Waste and Recycling Committee. Although this committee doesn't have the most glamorous of names, we rely on them for policy



recommendations and opportunities to reduce the Town's trash, which is not just important for our environment but also for our taxpayers' wallets. One important way to reduce trash is to encourage our residents to compost their food waste. Jim's enthusiasm for nature's way of recycling led to his creation of a pilot composting program in his Library Lane neighborhood. Just this summer, the neighborhood collected over 700 pounds of food waste for composting. Growing, Caring, Sharing. These are the guiding words of the Lyme-Old Lyme Food Share Garden. These three words also represent why the Board of Selectmen selected Mr. Jim Ward to be the 2023 Citizen of the Year. I urge you all to stop by and see the garden in action during the 2024 growing season.

Old Lyme is lucky to have so many talented and willing volunteers to serve on our 34 Boards, Commissions and Committees. January is the time of year when the Board of Selectmen make the majority of appointments for vacant and expiring positions. This year we appointed 69 residents to the various positions. We instituted some new processes this year so that our records are up-to-date, and we have current contact information. We know that the process had some technical glitches, but these improve our learning curve for the years to come. Executive Assistant to the First Selectwoman Katie Balocca, Town Clerk Vicki Urbowicz and Assistant Town Clerk Courtney Joy play important roles in updating our OnBoard2 software and swearing in all the new appointees. The Board of Selectmen are so appreciative of their efforts.

January is also the start of the budget review process. This year the Board of Selectmen spent over eighteen hours reviewing the requests of town departments, non-profit organizations and capital expenditures. Anita Mancini, our town Finance Director, spent countless hours preparing the budget and updating requests from departments throughout the months of December and January. Board of Finance members were also invited to our special budget workshop sessions to observe the process and ask questions for clarification. In February, the Board of Finance began their review and approval process during weekly meetings. This budget will be voted on by the residents and taxpayers at the Annual Town Meeting held in May.

Our Open Space and Harbor Management Commissions have worked closely together to create Horse Neck Creek Landing (formerly 36-1 Buttonball) throughout the fall season. Visitors now have a path through the wooded area to a beautiful viewing area along the Black Hall River. Members from both commissions took the time to put up a split rail fence to delineate the property lines from the abutting property owner. The Harbor Management Commission continues its plan to build a dock and viewing area for visitors.

The Lymes' Senior Center Building Committee has been hard at work these past months. Although the intention was for the project to begin in late fall, there were some higher-than-expected bids for the builder's risk insurance and new bids had to be sought. Bids

for the project itself were opened on February 6th. Meanwhile, our Senior Center Director, Stephanie Gould, and her assistant Caitlin Perkins continue to provide activities for the senior center members at various locations in Lyme and Old Lyme.

The Building Committee for the Region 18 HVAC replacement/repair has also been diligently working to finalize the project's scope and prepare for the bidding process. The bid packets should be ready in March. The project is slated to begin in June.

Assessor's Office

The Assessor would like to remind residents of two tax relief programs available for **Elderly Homeowners & Totally Disabled and Additional Veterans**. Applications are taken in the Assessor's Office beginning **February 1 through May 15, 2024**. To qualify, recipients must have reached the age of 65 or older by Dec 31st of the previous year (one spouse, if married) or be totally disabled as defined by the Social Security disability program. Eligibility is based on qualifying income requirements as set by the State of Connecticut. The 2023 qualifying income limits are \$43,800 for a single applicant and \$53,400 for a married couple. Applicants *may* **not** be receiving federal, state, county or municipal financial subsidy or aid. An additional Veterans Exemption is available for those who meet the Homeowners and Veterans eligibility and income requirements. These filings are done every 2 years or if your income has changed significantly; if you are already in the program, you will receive a reminder letter if it is your application year. Please call the Assessor's office x219 if you have any questions regarding application for this program.

We have commenced the state mandated revaluation project

of 2024 with the assistance of Municipal Valuations Services, LLC (Munival) of Fairfield, CT (the revaluation company hired to assist the Town with the revaluation). This process will take place from February 2024, thru October 31st, 2024. Frequent updates will be posted to the Assessor's webpage as we move through the process.



Registrars of Voters



There will be a **Presidential Preference Primary** held on Tuesday, April 2, 2024. Our polling location is the Lyme-Old Lyme Middle School gymnasium, located at 53 Lyme Street, Old Lyme. The polls will be open from 6:00 am to 8:00 pm. Only electors who are registered as a Democrat or a Republican are eligible to vote in this primary. Absentee ballots will be available from the Town Clerk's office beginning on March 12, 2024.

For the first time, we will also be offering **Early Voting**. Our Early Voting location is the Registrar of Voters office at the Old Lyme Memorial Town Hall on the mezzanine level. Handicap parking is available in the lot behind the Town Hall. Curbside voting will also be available upon request.

For a Presidential Preference Primary, early voting will take place for 4 days prior to the election day. There will be no early voting on Good Friday.

Early Voting dates will be:

- Tuesday, March 26
- Wednesday, March 27
- Thursday, March 28
- Saturday, March 30

The time for early voting for each of these days is 10:00 am – 6:00 pm.

Social Services

As spring approaches, Social Services expects to provide assistance with the **Renters' Rebate Program**. State law provides a reimbursement program for Connecticut renters who are elderly or totally disabled, and whose incomes do not exceed certain limits. Persons renting an apartment or room, or living in cooperative housing or a mobile home may be eligible for this program. The application period typically runs from April 1 – October 1. Call the office to schedule an appointment after April 1.

- People who generally make \$60,000 or less
- Persons with disabilities; and
- Limited English-speaking taxpayers

In addition to VITA, the TCE program offers free tax help, particularly for those who are 60 years of age and older, specializing in questions about pensions and retirement-related issues unique to seniors.

IF YOU'RE READING THIS, it's either spring or will be spring within days. Our reward for making it through another cold, wet winter is bright sunshine, longer days and green, growing grass and flowers springing from the earth. Spring's arrival is a great opportunity to focus on healthy habits.

The *Centers for Disease Control and Prevention* recommends picking up healthy habits in the spring to keep yourself in better shape and help prevent chronic diseases, and different strategies can find significant success. For instance, getting in the habit of using extra sunlight hours after Daylight Savings can be a great way to get more exercise. It's recommended that the average person gets *at least* 150 minutes of exercise every week; 30 minutes a day, five days a week is perfect to get tuned up.

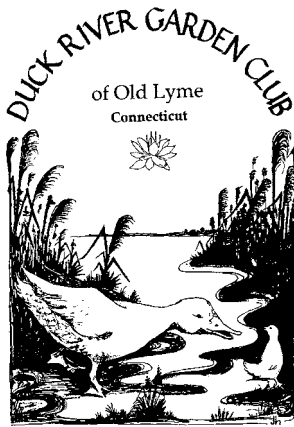

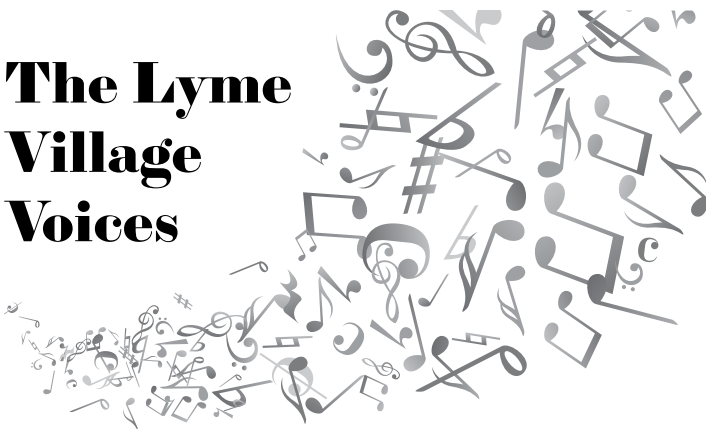

misuse. Studies show that a majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including from the home medicine cabinets.

Emergency Management Services

EMS is always updating safer and effective ways to treat sick and injured patients.

Caring for people has always been a humanitarian service, even during war time. In 1966, with so many accidents on the highway, the US Government asked the Traffic and Motor Vehicle Safety Act to help establish a comprehensive emergency medical care system. That is when The National Registry of Emergency Medical Technician (NREMT) was established in 1970.

Evidence showed that motorists were injured twice; once in an accident, then again when placed into a police car for transport to an ER.

Getting the sick or injured patient to the ER can be time sensitive, but trained steps of stabilizing the cervical spine, obtaining vitals and a brief history of events is of most importance before a quick transport.

Effective January 1, 2024, The American Heart Association provided evidence-based data that when providing CPR, the patient must be stabilized in place with concentrated compressions for at least eight minutes before transport. This is why all EMS responders are trained the same across the nation under the guidance of NREMT.

Since the fire department is deployed for every motor vehicle accident, more firefighters are taking a certified EMR course as well. This way they will be trained to be of assistance to stabilize and transfer patients to the ambulance, whether it be at an MVA, traumatic fall, medical situation, or initiating CPR.

An EMT can take extra classes to become an EMS instructor – they are called an EMSI. We are fortunate to have many EMSI's in our agency. They have come together to hold an EMR course for the Old Lyme firefighters in February for six weeks –led by David DelBiondo with Tisha Kirk, Ray Belval, Tom Rozanski and Juan Tirado.

To join OLEMS, you do not need to have medical training, just some spare time and a desire to help your community, we will help assist in finding a course for you. Call 860-434-0089 or stop by 6 am-5 pm at Cross Lane and a daytime EMT can provide you with an application (unless on a call) and inform our membership committee to reach out to you.

We still have an immense amount of work to do, not only in grappling with threats to the natural world, but also in addressing the environmental injustices of today. Luckily,

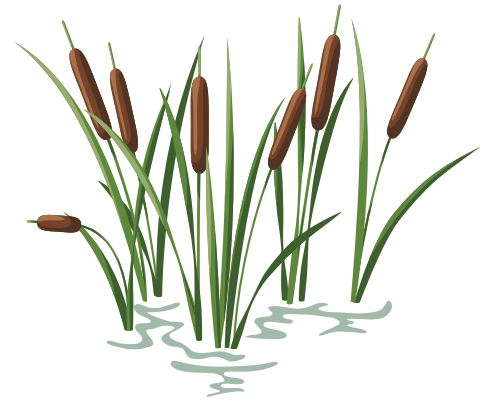
our conservation leaders are already pursuing solutions and providing educational resources in the form of lectures and seminars that can follow in the footsteps of earlier volunteer successes.

Florence Griswold Museum

Through May 19 the Florence Griswold Museum hosts the exhibition *Fun & Games? Leo Jensen's Pop Art*. Jensen (1926–2019) turned a winking eye on America, producing irreverent art that is nevertheless serious in its cultural observations. Known best regionally for his bronze frog sculptures on the Thread City Crossing Bridge in Willimantic,

Connecticut, Jensen infused his work with humor as well as insights about contemporary American society. Emerging in the 1950s, Pop Art challenged definitions of fine art by celebrating commercial culture, mass media, and elevating everyday objects to “high” art. The Minnesota-born Jensen’s paintings and sculptures borrow from the signs and symbols he saw during his youth in circuses and rodeos. When he moved to Connecticut, he continued to draw upon the visual language of carnival games in kinetic sculptures. Jensen made his mark on Pop Art with these moveable constructions, which the New York Herald Tribune in 1964 proclaimed “Superior ... witty, highly sophisticated in structure and design.”

Jensen moved from New Haven to Old Lyme in the early 1960s before converting an old restaurant into a home and studio in Ivoryton with wife Dalia Ramanaukas in 1966.

In addition to Pop Art, visitors to the Museum can view a selection of highlights of the Museum’s collection titled *From Art Colony to Connecticut Collection* – which includes recently acquired pieces

Information on Your Electric Bill

I often get asked about

Connecticut's electric rates and the supply and delivery charges on an Eversource invoice.

The supply side is based on a competitive procurement process and overall energy use; it is not regulated by PURA.

In 2022, the energy generation mix in Connecticut was 56.7% natural gas, 38.1% nuclear, 1.6% biomass & refuse-derived fuels, 1% solar, 1% hydroelectric, 0.4% petroleum, and 1.1% "other." One

of the main reasons costs are higher than most states, especially in the winter months, is our reliance on natural gas coupled with limited access to it due to pipeline capabilities. Connecticut is also restricted in acquiring more hydroelectric from Canada until nearby states allow for new transmission upgrades. You can compare rates at <https://energizect.com/> and select a new supplier if the plan makes sense to you, however, Eversource will still deliver your energy.

In 2023, the legislature enacted legislation to create more transparency about what the delivery charge truly means. If you look at your Eversource bill, you will see the supply charges and three other categories. These three – transmission, local delivery, and public benefits – are not new costs, but, rather, the old delivery charge broken down. Transmission is the cost to maintain and build high voltage towers and lines and is regulated by the federal government. It is also affected by usage. The Local Delivery charge is the cost to Eversource to build, maintain, and repair poles, meters, and local power lines. This cost is regulated by PURA. The Public Benefits charge is the cost to support energy programs authorized by the state and fluctuates with use.

I am always looking for suggestions as to how to reduce costs and make our grid more efficient, so please contact me with any thoughts – devin.carney@housegop.ct.gov.

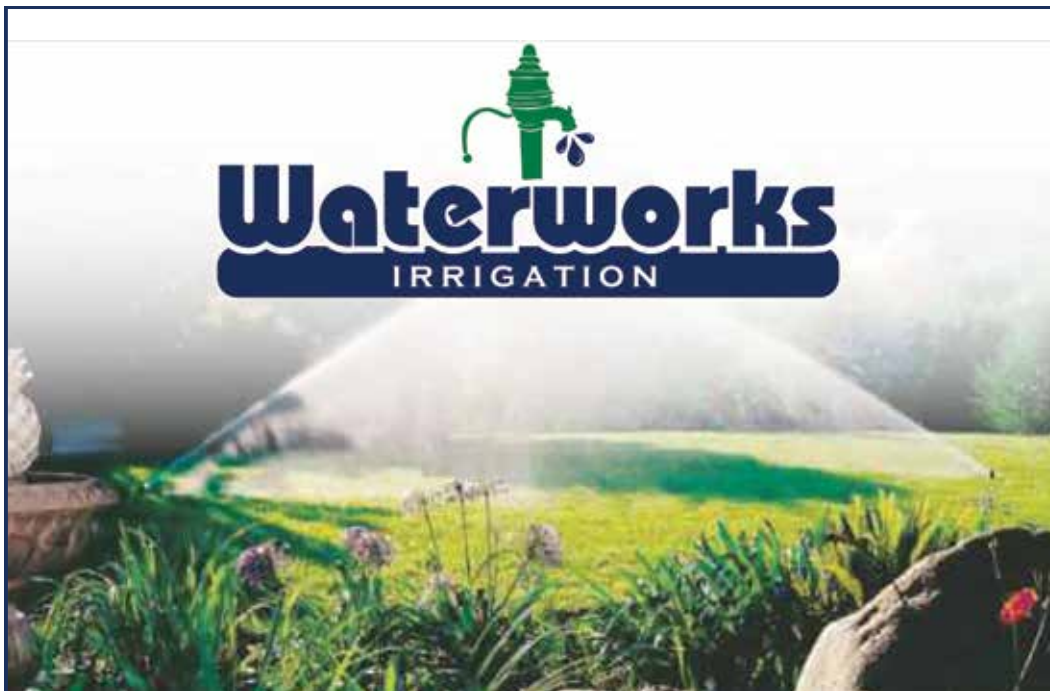

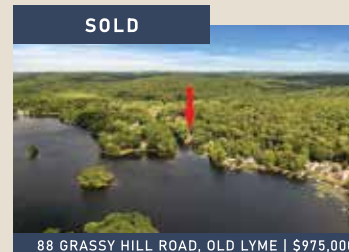

Lyme-Old Lyme Schools

Music Education at Lyme-Old Lyme Schools

Music is a well-loved part of the curriculum at Lyme-Old Lyme Schools, from elementary school where the foundation is built, to high school where student musicians can join numerous vocal and instrumental ensembles.

Beginning in Pre-K students participate in weekly lessons that help them become comfortable with singing and dancing while developing vocal and rhythmic skills. By second grade, students continue to fine-tune vocals, learn to read music, and begin to create their own music. Fifth-graders have the option to begin the study of an instrument.

Students can continue on with band and chorus through middle and high school through a variety of concert groups and ensembles. Additionally, the high school offers course work in music history, music theory, music exploration, music production, and musical theater performance as well as AP and UConn Early College Experience classes.

Student musicians contribute to the community in many ways including performances at the Old Lyme Memorial Day Parade and Dedication Ceremony, Lymes' Senior Center, LYSB, and local churches among others. The Veterans' Day Assemblies held at the middle and high school are much-anticipated events where our student musicians really shine.

Students in ensemble classes are encouraged to audition for regional, state, and national festivals. This year, 12 students have been selected for the New England Music Festival. An international music performance tour is offered biannually, including a tour of Ireland in 2023 with performances in Cork, Galway, and Dublin, as well as a scheduled tour of England and Wales in February 2025.

Melissa Rostkoski, music teacher at Lyme School, sums it up when she says, "Lyme and Old Lyme are wonderful communities to be in when it comes to music. Our communities are very arts-driven and so supportive of our schools."

Coyotes and Dogs

Old Lyme's open space trails are respites from our busy lives where we can exercise and enjoy the outdoors, often with our dogs. In addition to providing recreation, open space also preserves natural habitat.

We share open space (and often our neighborhoods) with wild animals, and that requires care.

Eastern coyotes are common, and there have been incidents of conflict between coyotes and dogs in town. (Bobcats and even black bears can also pose a danger to pets).

Coyote pups are born in the spring (April to mid-May) and parents tend to be protective near den sites. It's a time to be especially cautious while walking dogs. **A reminder:** dogs should be kept on leash on open space trails for their safety.

Here are basic tips:

- If approached by a coyote, keep your dog under close control and calmly leave the area.
- Do not run or turn your back.
- Let them know you are the boss. To frighten coyotes shout, make noise, wave your arms.
- Do not pick up your dog.
- Be wary of behavior that may indicate rabies, such as staggering or extreme lethargy. Daytime coyote activity is not uncommon and does not necessarily mean an animal is rabid.
- Any coyote acting aggressively should be reported to DEEP's Emergency Dispatch at (860) 424-3333 and the Town of Old Lyme animal control officer at 860-434-1605 ext. 244.

Raccoons, skunks, and foxes can also be infected with rabies. All bites by wildlife should be considered a possible risk for the disease.

Be polite on trails: not everyone is a dog lover, and fellow hikers may be startled or frightened by a strange dog rapidly running towards them.
