First Selectman's Corner

The Town of Old Lyme held a Special Town Meeting on Monday March 21st to consider four items: appropriating \$45,000 for the Halls Road sidewalk project, appropriating \$21,622 for the Ledge Light Health District, approving the use of the Standard Allowance for the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") reporting and approving an amended Deed of Conservation Restriction for the Town's McCulloch property. All four items were approved. The Halls Road funding will allow the Committee to apply for significant grant funding to construct a sidewalk along Halls Road and to construct a replacement "Bow Bridge" over the Lieutenant River. In addition, the funds would provide for an easement for a walking trail from the Bow Bridge to the Florence Griswold Museum and for work on a Village District Overlay Zone. The Ledge Light funding would provide needed assistance to our health district, as it deals with COVID issues. The Standard Allowance simplifies the reporting requirements associated with the disbursement of the Town's \$2.1 million of ARPA funds and the McCulloch deed will allow for parking and other enhancements at certain Open Space trail heads.

On March 8th, the Board of Selectmen voted to make the wearing of face masks in Town Hall optional. While the Town's COVID caseload count, since the beginning of the pandemic through March 19th, increased by 167 to 1,055, people who contracted the virus seem to have less severe cases.

The Board Finance has completed its work on the fiscal year 30 June 2023 Town budget and this involved weekly meetings for about 10 weeks. The major components of the budget have the following proposed percentage increases: General Government: 3.88%, Capital Expenditures: 158% and School: 1.91%. The Total Town budget is budgeted to increase 4.34%. Revenues are estimated to increase 3.86% and the Board plans to use \$600,000 of the Town's \$10.5 million surplus to support the budget. All considered, the Mill Rate is budgeted to be 23.5 mills, which represents an increase of 0.2 mill or a 0.86% increase. Notable spending increases relate to insurance (\$81,000,) Rogers Lake (\$22,200,) Parks & Rec./ Fireworks (\$42,800) and Police (\$73,700.) Capital Expenditures are budgeted to increase \$726,775, a bulk of which relates to the architectural schematic drawings for the Senior Center Expansion project (\$281,000) and funding to replace the Grassy Hill Road bridge (\$355,000.) Non-tax revenues are estimated to increase \$404,300 and relate primarily to the Town of Lyme's payment of its 25% share of the Senior Center Expansion (\$70,250) and increased State revenues (\$333,100.)

The Town Budget meeting will occur on May 16th and the agenda will also request approval to accept an open space parcel located at 18-2 Short Hills Road, to sell a 0.13-acre parcel at 54 Grandview Ave. for a price of \$3,500 and of an ordinance giving the Board of Selectmen authority to remove an appointed member or alternate from a Town Board, Commission or Authority for cause.

On March 25th, the Board of Selectmen voted to opt out of the Town's Solid Waste Disposal contract with the Materials Innovation and Recovery Authority ("MIRA.") MIRA has been experiencing significant financial problems and will likely close its trash to energy plant in Hartford on or about July 1st. The Town was given the opportunity to remain with MIRA for 5 more years but our current trash hauler (CWPM) offered an attractive 5 year contract to replace MIRA, effective July 1st.

Michael Fogliano, Chair of the Affordable Housing Commission, briefed the Selectmen about the draft of the Old Lyme Five-Year Affordable Housing Plan update that must be submitted to the State of CT by June 1st. It is an encompassing plan and is the culmination of several years of work. The Commission worked in collaboration with our CT River Council of Governments. Once submitted, a copy of the plan will be on the Town's website.

The Rogers Lake Authority had a meeting in Town Hall on April 19th that attracted about 75 people. The principal item of interest was the Authority's plan to create a No Wake Zone across a portion of the Lake that includes Picnic and Whale Islands. Unfortunately, the Authority decided to pursue a DEEP No Wake Permit (and did so,) but did not inform members of the public about the plan. Once the word got out, there was a visceral reaction against it. Those opposed to the plan said the current arrangement works well and pointed out that there have been no accidents reported. A short time after the meeting, the Authority voted to table the matter. Hopefully, the Authority will have a more thorough and public discussion about any change of plans being pursued.

Another controversial item concerns the use of a Town owned 3-acre parcel located at 36-1 Buttonball Road. The McGowan family sold the parcel to the State of CT in March of 1958 and the Open Space Committee (now a Commission) that was part of the Conservation Commission, negotiated the purchase of the parcel on 6 Feb 2002, subject to a deed restriction that the premises be used for "recreational access to the CT River only." Over the years since, the parcel has remained undeveloped. Recently, the Harbor Management Commission recommended that improvements be made to the property, including parking and possibly adding a dock, to enable members of the public to access the water. The Open Space Commission is concerned about what the public access and a dock would do to the marsh

It is with a heavy heart that I write this note about the passing of a true legend - Joan Joyce. I had the pleasure and honor to meet her (over the phone) as part of putting together our The Last Word feature article that appeared in Events Magazines for the 4th quarter of 2020. It is a conversation I will remember forever. Her ever so clear memory of the many great moments in her athletic career was astonishing – from Raybestos Brakettes softball games, to striking out Ted Williams and Hank Aaron, to golf moments, to how her coaching career came about. (She would tell you that she has been coaching all her life.) And of course, her father – whom she loved tremendously. Up until he passed, she would keep a room for him in her house in Florida and he would attend all the Florida Atlantic University softball games.

It is hard to believe that there was not more fanfare about this superb athlete who excelled in so many sports. That is until you spoke with her and found out how matter-of-fact she took everything. She could have been boastful or arrogant. But she was not. Instead, you could tell how much joy she found in all that she did. I had fun sharing stories about growing up in West Haven and the various individuals I had no idea we knew mutually.

And, of course, there was the ever-competitive spirit that came through not only in talking about her Florida Atlantic softball team but also about her own goals – even at the age of 80. As I recall, she recounted the story of helping a friend move. She stumbled while carrying a box. Her volleyball training helped break the fall. She did injure her hip. During the course of the conversation, it suddenly occurred to her. "Maybe I could golf left-handed," she said. If anyone can do it, I'd bet on you, I observed.

In honor of Joan Joyce, we are re-publishing The Last Word feature that ran in 2020. You will find it on page 54 of this magazine. For those of you who knew or knew of Joan, it is a fond reminder of her greatness and grace. For those of you who did not, it is a way to read about and acknowledge an amazing life.

and to local wildlife. The Board of Selectmen conducted a meeting of the Selectmen and members of the Harbor Management and Open Space Commissions to discuss the issue. It was agreed that further research would be done before any changes to the property were made.

Speaking of water access, the property abutters of the Town's Tantommaheag Landing have stated that they, and not the Town, own the Landing property and have actually planted bushes on the Landing, cut down or trimmed Landing trees and have erected a retaining wall partially on the property. The members of the Board of Selectmen do not agree with the abutters and we are working with the Town's legal counsel to address the problem.

TOWN PROJECT UPDATES:

Sound View Sidewalks: The sidewalk project (Hartford Ave. and Rte. 156) is substantially complete and the contractor is working on the Transit Hub bus shelter for the 9 Town Transit District busses. The entire project should be substantially complete by Memorial Day.

Halls Rd. Improvement Committee: The Committee's \$45,000 request was approved at the March 21st Special Town Meeting, so the Committee is now working on the sidewalk/Bow Bridge grant application, the easement to enable a walking trail to the Florence Griswold Museum property, and legal and engineering services to develop the Village District Overlay Zone.

Sound View Sewers: Because the second round of bids for the "shared infrastructure" of the sewer project, consisting of the collection pipe, the pumping station, the force main pipe to East Lyme plus the odor control facility, were too high, the three private beaches and the Town's WPCA are actively pursuing Federal grants to enable the project to move forward. Another concern is whether the CT DOT will continue to postpone the repaving of Rte. 156 from Halls Road to the East Lyme border. The DOT has already waited to pave for about two years and we hope it will continue to wait until we can install the force main pipe from Sound View to the East Lyme pump station.

Senior Center Building Expansion: As was mentioned above, the Towns of Lyme and Old Lyme are providing \$281,000 in their fiscal year 2023 budgets to fund the schematic design drawings for the Senior Center expansion. Once done, the estimated \$3.4 million project could go out to bid.

Grassy Hill Rd. Bridge Replacement: The Town's engineering firm, Jacobson Engineering of Chester, CT, has nearly finished the engineering work for the Grassy Hill Road bridge project. The next step is to secure approval from the Army Corps of Engineers and to meet with the utility companies to decide on the relocation of their wires. The actual construction of the replacement bridge would likely not occur until the spring/summer of 2023. We are still awaiting confirmation from the DOT that it will approve the project's time delay and that it confirms its commitment to fund 50% of the revised cost estimate of the project.

Ferry Rd. Sidewalk Replacement: The Tree Warden recommended that a total of five trees be removed along Ferry Road, in preparation for the sidewalk replacement. He posted the trees and there were no appeals received during the ten-day appeal period. The Ferry Rd. Sidewalk Committee held a Public Information meeting in

the Town Hall on May 4th that was attended by about 12 townspeople. The power point presentation reviewed which trees are scheduled to be removed and what the next steps will be. Construction of the new sidewalk is planned for the latter part of September or early October. We hope we will receive competitive bids during this turbulent economic climate.

Swan Brook Outlet: The decision was made to repair the wood cribbing at the end of the two 36-inch pipes at Long Island Sound to make the crib safe and functional in time for the summer. The request for the Certificate of Permission (permit) has been submitted and our engineer said we may receive approval by mid-May. The Army Corps of Engineers must also approve the project and we are hopeful that work may begin shortly after Memorial Day.

American Rescue Plan Committee: The Committee set a May 1st deadline to receive applications from community members requesting ARPA funds. A consultant is assisting with underwriting requests received from individuals and small businesses and the Committee will evaluate municipal requests. In June, the Town will receive its second and final 50% of the \$2.1 million of ARPA funds, so the Committee will soon be making disbursements.

The Lyme-Old Lyme "Welcome" mural that now graces the gymnasium hallway in the LOL Middle School is one of four **Public Art for Racial Justice Education ("PARJE") Sister murals in southeastern CT:** Lyme-Old Lyme & New London and East Lyme & Norwich. Rev. David Good, Middle School Art Instructor Thelma Halloran, Artist Nancy Gladwell, Kimberly Monson and Jac Lahav have spearheaded the LOL mural project. Lyme Academy College of Fine Arts graduate Jasmine Oyola-Blumenthal was selected as the supervising artist and was joined by a number of Middle School students to plan and paint the mural. The mural was celebrated during a ceremony in the Middle School auditorium on April 27th.

Last, but not least, we are proud of High School Freshman Andrea DeBarnardo who was selected to represent Connecticut at the 2022 Special Olympics USA Games in Orlando, Fla in June. Andrea will be participating in gymnastics and we wish her all success.

The spring flowers and flowering trees are beautiful this year, thanks in part to some cooler temperatures but soon we will be complaining on how hot is. Enjoy the summer weather and its outside activities!

Assessors Office

The Assessor would like to bring to your attention the following important deadlines.

Beginning in the month of May the Assessor and staff will be conducting field reviews and building permit inspections on an ongoing basis. If you see us out and about in town, feel free to say hello.

Per CGS 12-41, All business operating in the Town of Old Lyme are required to file a list of Business Personal Property with the Assessor's Office on or before November 1, 2022. Declaration forms will be mailed by

the end of September. Failure to receive a form from our office does not relieve the obligation of the business owner to file prior to November. Additional information and forms are available on our website.

Any Service Members eligible for a Veterans Exemption under CGS 12-81 must have on file their DD214 or equivalent discharge papers with the Town Clerk before October 1, 2022.

Any property owner wishing to file for Farm, Forest and Open Space under PA490 must file an application with the Assessor

between September 1 and October 31, 2022. Applications are available online or in the Assessor's Office.

Tax Collector's Legal Notice for the Town of Old Lyme

Notice is hereby given to the Taxpayers of the Town of Old Lyme that I have a warrant to collect the taxes on the Grand List of October 1, 2021. Motor Vehicle taxes are due in full July 1, 2022, Real Estate and Personal Property bills may be paid in full on that date, however, Real Estate and Personal Property bills over \$100.00 are paid in two installments: July 1, 2022 and January 1, 2023. Partial payments are always accepted.

If the tax due, or installment due, is not paid within one month of the due date, the tax becomes delinquent and subject to interest at the rate of one and one half percent (1 1/2%): 18% per year. The minimum interest charge is \$2.00. August interest is 3%.

SENIOR FARMERS' MARKET NUTRITION PROGRAM

The SFMNP is a supplemental food program for individuals over the age of 60, or those who are disabled living in housing where congregate nutrition services are provided and meet income eligibility. Each eligible participant receives one (1) \$18 check booklet annually containing six (6) three-dollar (\$3) checks. SFMNP checks can be redeemed at FMNP authorized locations throughout Connecticut for fruits, vegetables, fresh cut herbs, and honey. The program begins on July 1, and we expect to receive the checks to distribute sometime in the month of June.

RENTERS' REBATE

The application period for the Elderly / Totally Disabled Renters' Rebate program runs through October 1st. State law provides a reimbursement program for Connecticut renters who are elderly or totally disabled, and whose incomes do not exceed certain limits. Please contact the office for more

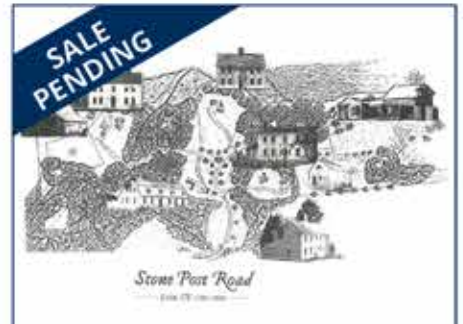

Halls Road Improvements Committee

The Halls Road Improvements Committee (HRIC) is moving forward on several fronts.

With the town meeting approval of additional funds to institute the **Halls Road Master Plan**, the committee has three initiatives to accomplish:

1. The BSC Group is putting together the needed details to apply for the **Local Transportation Capital Improvement Program (LOTICIP) grant** by the fall of 2022. This is a state-run grant and is the first opportunity for the town to formally submit the planned roadway improvements to the CT DOT. This application will cover the planned improvements to sidewalks, bike lanes, landscaping, lighting, and crosswalks along Halls Road. The LOTICIP grant could cover a substantial part of the construction costs of these improvements. It is not expected to cover the costs of the new pedestrian- and cyclist-bridge across the Lieutenant, or the trails leading to and from it.
2. The town is working to secure an easement from the property owner on the east bank of the Lieutenant where the new bridge will land. This will make it possible to seek additional grants to defray construction costs of the bridge and trails portion the Master Plan. HRIC has also applied for funding for the formal survey and design work required for the bridge and trails through the **Community Initiatives Grant**, a part of the town-administered **American Rescue Plan**.

3. **New zoning** for a mixed-use overlay district will soon be submitted to the Zoning Commission. This will allow property owners the option to create mixed-use (commercial and residential) development and bring retail up to Halls Road. The overlay district provides an incentive for owners to create the walkable, browse-able new town center envisioned in the Master Plan, while leaving the legacy C30-S zoning unchanged.

LOOKING TOWARD THE 2022-2023 SCHOOL YEAR

On May 3 the \$34.8 million budget passed by overwhelming majorities in each town. This budget represents a 0.13% decrease from the current budget. Employee contractual obligations are the main driver of the budget based on growth in enrollment.

These costs are offset by reductions in health insurance costs, special education, debt service and transportation. This budget allows for continued adherence to class size guidelines, continuance of existing academic and extracurricular activities, adjustments for anticipated changes in the special education population, adequate funding for maintenance and repair of buildings and grounds, scheduled replacement of technology and equipment, and program improvements that are consistent with high academic and operational standards.

We thank the communities of Lyme and Old Lyme for their ongoing support of our schools. Our schools would not achieve the level of success that we do without the support of our communities.

There is no trash pick-up on the following Holidays:

Christmas (Dec. 25,) New Year's (Jan. 1,) Memorial Day (last Monday in May), July 4th, Labor Day (first Monday in Sept.,) and Thanksgiving Day (fourth Thursday in Nov.). Trash normally collected on Thanksgiving will be picked up the next day (Friday,) and regular Friday pickup will be picked up on Saturday. Please be advised that CWPM DOES NOT take off the same holidays as the Town does.

Please have trash container out at curbside by 6:00 am on your assigned day. Containers should be three feet away from any other objects, such as mailboxes, cars, other containers, planters, etc. Please be mindful not to block breakdown/emergency lane with receptacle. Clearly mark your address on recycling and trash receptacles to avoid mix up, removal or displacement of cans. Phone Michele Hayes at: 860-434-1605, ext. 212 with any additional trash removal questions that you may have.

Single stream curbside recycling pick-up is provided for clean bottles, cans, plastics and paper products co-mingled in the green recycling carts every week. Corrugated cardboard boxes need to be flattened for recycling. Transfer Station Information

TRANSFER STATION/LANDFILL HOURS

The Transfer Station is located on Four Mile River Road and is open Tuesday - Friday, 7:30 am - 3:45 pm, Saturday, 8:30 am - 4:00 pm. Closed Sunday and Monday. Taxpayers' vehicles should have a Transfer Station sticker affixed to the right-hand side of windshield. Vehicles without a sticker should bring proof of property address (i.e., tax bill, mortgage statement or closing papers,) along with a driver's license and registration.

Electronics are now accepted at the Transfer Station: Residents can bring the following items to the Transfer Station on Four Mile River Road: computers (personal computers, mainframes, med-range computers, laptops); networking equipment (hubs, switches, control cards, etc.); computer monitors, televisions, printers, keyboards, mice, adaptors, stereos, speakers, VCR's, scanners, fax machines, copiers telephones and telephone systems, computer wire and cable; computer drives and storage devices (floppy drives, CD ROMs, hard drives), power supplies, circuit boards, microwaves, scrap copper (cable, pipe, etc.), scrap aluminum (machine and machine parts, cable extrusions, etc.), fluorescent light bulbs, UPA (uninterrupted power supply) batteries, and related computer and electronic equipment.

Recycling Area: No fees for the following items (with windshield sticker.)

*Waste Oil *Motor vehicle batteries *Small appliances (no freon) *Mattress & box springs *Covered and non-covered electronic devices *Fluorescent light bulbs * UPS (uninterrupted power supply) batteries, and related computer and electronic equipment.

Fees apply for the following: Tires: Auto w/no rim \$3 each, Auto w/rim \$4 each, Light Truck \$5 each, Heavy Truck/Race Car \$13 each, Construction Equipment \$100 per tire. *No Retail or Wholesale Tire Outlets.*

Upholstered furniture: Large \$10 per item, Small \$5 per item; Carpet 8x10+ \$10 per item; 8x10 or less \$5 per item; Appliances with Freon: \$10 each, Propane tanks: less than 20 pounds \$1; tanks 20 pounds (grill size) \$3, less than 20 pounds \$20 each.

Bulky Waste and Demolition: Vehicles will be charged by weight at 6 cents per pound or \$120 per ton. Loads less than 100 lbs. are charged a minimum fee of \$5. Recyclables should not be mixed in the same load with Bulky Waste or Demolition Debris.

Brush is charged on a per load basis with a \$5 minimum, 2 cents per pound or \$40 per ton. No wood or limbs thicker than four inches are accepted.

Grass clippings are not allowed at the Transfer Station because of chemical contamination from pesticides and fertilizers and cannot be deposited in your trash can. Please compost on your property.

Leaves: No commercial leaf disposal is allowed; minimum charge is \$5; Pickup truck or small trailer charge is \$15; larger vehicles/trailers - Charge determined by Town personnel. *Resident must empty and remove paper or plastic bags.*

2022 Parking Pass Information

In response to many requests for a parking pass not restricted to a single vehicle, our Parking Permits are hanging tags that can be moved among your vehicles, just as last year. This means you'll be able to use the hanging permit for any car registered to you/your family in Old Lyme.

Because the hanging permits can be used on multiple vehicles, the cost is \$30 per permit. If you want to purchase a second pass, the fee is an additional \$45 for a second one (\$75 for two passes.) Limit 2 passes per household. Permits will be sold by filling out Parking Pass Application online at: www.ouldlyme-ct.gov and mailing in check or money order to the Selectman's Office, Att: Parking Pass, 52 Lyme Street, Old Lyme, CT 06371. Please provide the EXACT address that you would like your pass(es) mail to. Please be prepared to follow the instructions on the Parking Permit application form and provide proof of residency as well as payment.

For 2022, we can only accept checks or money orders payable to Town of Old Lyme. If you must pay with cash, please be prepared with the exact amount.

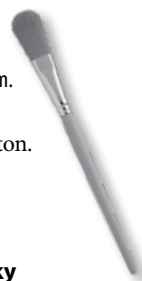

Old Lyme residents volunteer in so many ways to help keep the community safe, strong, healthy, and educated. One group of volunteers that have been very busy are the 17 active members of the Medical Reserve Corps from Old Lyme who stepped up to the plate when the pandemic started. Many of our most active volunteers are from Old Lyme! We are fortunate to have such dedicated volunteers who think nothing of driving from Old Lyme to North Stonington to work at a vaccination clinic. Some are physicians, nurses, EMTs and others are non-medical. They all have and continue to play a vital role in helping to keep people healthy during this pandemic.

Ledge Light Health District has an active Medical Reserve Corps unit of over 300 volunteers that has been in existence since 2007. Since the pandemic started our volunteers, medical and non-medical, have supported contact tracing, COVID testing, community meal and food pantries in New London and COVID vaccination clinics. They have also continued to help with non-COVID related events, like our drive-thru flu clinics. The Medical Reserve Corps was formed after 9/11 when President George W. Bush called for an organization that credentialed and trained volunteers to respond to public health emergencies. Today, there are over 800 units nationwide. The Medical Reserve Corps Program Office is the national office of the MRC and is housed within the Readiness Division, Office of Emergency Management and Medical Operations, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response (ASPR,) U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS.) Striving For a Sense of Normalcy

Every person, in every situation, had unique challenges and changes over the past two years from COVID-19. Levels of stress and loneliness were undoubtedly amplified, financial burdens weighed heavier, and periods of isolation grew longer.

One group in particular, cancer patients, were faced with some pretty serious dilemmas. As we were all told to hunker down and stay home, for cancer patients that created tough choices. Staying at home had potential to increase tumor/illness progression, while visiting the hospital for treatment had potential to increase infection risk. Navigating through an illness can often make someone feel like they are alone in what they are experiencing. And quite literally, for many, that was their reality. While our connections to loved ones remained intact, they looked and felt a bit different. Relationships with doctors and care teams were partially virtual and felt long distanced.

As we now attempt to resume a sense of normalcy in our world and community, we can take advantage of different support systems, too. As either the patient or the caregiver, therapy is available to you as another layer of your healing.

Midsummer Festival Returns July 30! - Kickoff Concert Friday Evening July 29

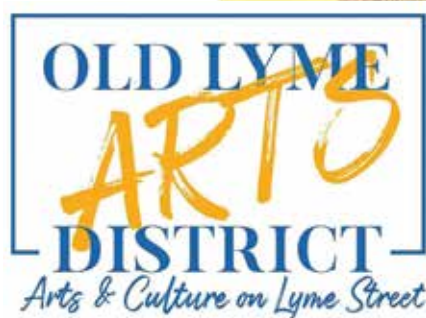

Vernal Ponds / Pools Care and Maintenance

Vernal ponds are temporary wetlands that fill after the snowfall each spring. They become the seasonal breeding and feeding grounds for many intriguing amphibians and insects, as well as the reptiles, birds, and mammals that depend on them for food.

It's easy to recognize vernal ponds in the late winter and early spring. Generally drying up in late summer, these ponds are only temporary woodland reservoirs. The seasonal nature of vernal ponds means that they are uninhabited by fish. This makes them the perfect habitat for a variety of amphibians and invertebrates to breed and develop with less chance of preying animals.

The first creatures to arrive each season are Jefferson salamanders. During the same period, wood frogs make their trek to the ponds. As activity inside the pond increases each spring, it attracts other animals to the vernal community. By late spring or early summer, tens of thousands of young salamanders and frogs that have undergone metamorphosis leave the pond for the forest to continue their



life cycles. The ability of vernal ponds to continue supporting this biodiversity

remains dependent on the activities occurring around them.

Protecting Your Vernal Pond

- Avoid using chemicals and fertilizers
- Maintain forest canopy
- Do not add or remove plant debris
- Do not drain ponds
- Protect water quality
- Do not add fish or other animals
- Do not remove any plants or animals from pond
- Keep timber harvesting operations to a minimum

Rogers Lake Authority News - Summer

All types of boating activity are well underway on Rogers Lake. Safety of all people utilizing the lake is the primary focus of the Rogers Lake Authority. The patrol boat is available to lend assistance as needed and can be reached at: 860-227-4285. As a reminder, there is a 6 MPH speed limit from sunset until 10:00 am. Remember you are responsible for your wake and must stay at least 100 feet from shore, rafts, or other stationary objects. Jet skis are only allowed 10:00 am - 6:00 pm weekdays and until 7:00 pm on weekends. Jet skis must stay 200 feet from shore, rafts, or other stationary objects. There are six places on the lake where jet skis cannot maintain this 200-foot distance and must proceed at a 6 MPH speed limit. This will be heavily enforced this year for the safety of all on the water. The RLA asks for your assistance in reporting unsafe activity occurring on Rogers Lake. To report such activity visit RLA's website at: www.oldlyme-ct.gov/rogers-lake-authority. If unsafe activity needs immediate action, call 911.

During a study of the endangered **Eastern Pond Mussel**, the invasive **Asian Clam** was found at Hains Park. In late June and early July, remediation will take place to find and remove the Asian Clams. Connecticut DEEP has asked that no mussel or clam shells be removed from the Hains Beach area.

The Connecticut Agricultural Experiment Station did a two-week study of the aquatic weeds in Rogers Lake last summer. Their report identified five invasive aquatic weeds scattered around the lake. These invasive aquatic weeds have different growing seasons and will require treatment during the spring, summer, and fall. Notifications will be posted around the lake and on the Lyme and Old Lyme websites prior to any treatments.

“DO NOT FEED THE WATERFOWL”

The Connecticut Department of Environmental Protection indicates waterfowl are wild birds that can locate natural food sources throughout the year. Supplemental feeding by people is unnecessary and can lead to malnutrition and disease transmission.

Connecticut State law 12-155 prohibits the use of a fertilizer containing phosphorous less than 20 feet from any body of water. A \$500 fine is imposed on violators. If you have questions on the phosphorus legislation or soil testing, call the UConn Home & Garden Education Center at: 877-486-6271.

Capitol Update

The 2022 Regular Legislative Session came to an end at midnight on May 4th. The General Assembly took action on a wide range of issues facing residents. I want to highlight two health and wellness related bills that I hope will make a positive impact for the people of Connecticut.

Especially during the last two years we have seen a dramatic increase in the rates of youth depression, suicide, substance abuse, and other behavioral health challenges. This has exposed the shortfalls with our state's mental health infrastructure. Emergency rooms have been inundated with patients awaiting placement into inpatient psychiatric beds and schools have faced a shortage of mental health professionals.

I strongly advocated for HB 5001 "An Act Concerning Children's Mental Health." This wide-ranging legislation aims to tackle the youth mental health crisis by growing the behavioral health workforce, expanding treatment facilities, and increasing insurance coverage for mental health services. Additionally, the legislation would establish a 9-8-8 suicide prevention and mental health crisis lifeline.

We all have family, friends, and neighbors who know all too well the impact breast cancer or ovarian cancer can have - and obstacles facing those seeking screening and treatment. I supported and co-sponsored SB 358 "An Act Concerning Required Health Insurance Coverage for Breast and Ovarian Cancer Susceptibility Screening." This legislation will expand coverage requirements for diagnostic treatments used to screen for breast and ovarian cancer. Early detection and treatment lead to better outcomes.

Joan Joyce - Our Finest Athlete by Sigrid Kun

Many fondly remember going to Raybestos Memorial field in Stratford, CT. Amid chants of "Joanie, Joanie," the softball phenom mowed down the competition. Joan Joyce dominated women's fast pitch softball for decades - beginning her amateur career at age 13 with the Raybestos Brakettes. The Waterbury, CT native excelled at every sport she tried - a true competitor, a lifelong coach/mentor. Joyce combines an unbridled, remarkable talent with a matter of fact, humble personality. While she readily speaks about her success, there is no bragging.

Many consider her as "The Greatest Woman Athlete of All Time." Her jaw-dropping achievements/honors take pages to list, including 20 Hall of Fame inductions, Connecticut Athlete of the Year (selected by the Connecticut Sports Writers Alliance), and a softball field renamed Joan Joyce Field (a part of Municipal Stadium in Waterbury).

A LIFETIME OF ASTOUNDING ACHIEVEMENTS

Joyce's softball career covered 1954-1963 and 1967-1975 with the Brakettes and 1964-1966 with the Orange Lionettes. The slingshot pitcher notched 150 no-hitters and 50 perfect games with a lifetime earned run average of 0.09. An outstanding hitter, her career batting average is .327. In 1974, her Brakettes were the first American team to win the World Championships.

She co-founded the International Women's Professional Softball Association, being the star player for

and part-owner of the Connecticut Falcons. The Falcons won every championship of the IWPSA's existence (1976-1979).

She is a four-time Women's Basketball Association All-American and three time AAU Basketball All-American. She played on the USA Women's National Team in 1964 and 1965, setting a national tournament basketball single-game scoring record (67 points) in 1964.

She formed the Connecticut Clippers volleyball team in 1968, and competed as a player/coach. She was named to the All-East United States Volleyball Association Regional Team. Taking up golf at age 35, she spent 19 years on the LPGA tour (1977-1995). She still holds the LPGA and PGA record of just 17 putts in one round of golf.

Now 80, Joyce is the women's softball coach at Florida Atlantic University. Starting the program from scratch in 1994, she has amassed 12 Conference Championships, participated in 11 NCCA Tournaments, and won 8 Coach-of-the Year Awards.

THE SECRET TO SUCCESS?

"I don't know," she says. "The only thing I can say about me is that I am very competitive. . . . I will beat you at just about everything. If you beat me, I'd shake hands. But I'd say to myself, you are not going to beat me a second time."

Her mother worked days. She, her father (above) and brother played sports all the time. "We would end up going to my father's softball games," she recalls. "We had no gloves. We'd run around everywhere while my father was playing. When they came in from the field, they'd put the gloves under the bench. We'd take them and start catching. When they went back in the field, they'd have to come and get the gloves back from us." When her father played basketball, she and her brother would wait for the halftime buzzer and then fly onto the court to play.

Striking Out Ted Williams/Hank Aaron. She calls striking out Ted Williams (left) and Hank Aaron her favorite moments. "It's the easiest thing I've ever done in my life," she relates. "They had no chance against a softball pitcher just because of the distance." She faced Williams as part

of fundraisers in 1961 and 1966; Aaron in 1978 in a West Hartford exhibition. There were no radar guns then. A doctorate study from USC determined her pitching speed to be the equivalent of 119 mph in baseball.

Invited to China by the All-China Sports Federation (1979).

"It was the first team ever invited to China," she recalls of the Connecticut Falcons. "When we played our last game sixty thousand people came to the game. I was looking out and it was like a flood of people just coming and coming and coming. And I'm thinking, 'Oh, my God!'" The American team won all six games. In the final game, Joyce pitched a no-hitter to beat the Chinese all-star team.

Joyce pitched a no hitter against Australia. "Only one walk. And we picked her off," notes Joyce. "It would have been a perfect game." She also stymied Japan, giving up only two hits. No team wore helmets then. Japan showed up wearing them. Was it to distract her or out of fear of her? "It didn't work," she laughs. "You did not want to get me focused or to get my attention. Stare at me? Give me looks? I would say to myself,

keep doing that 'cause you're never going to beat me. I just didn't like to lose."
